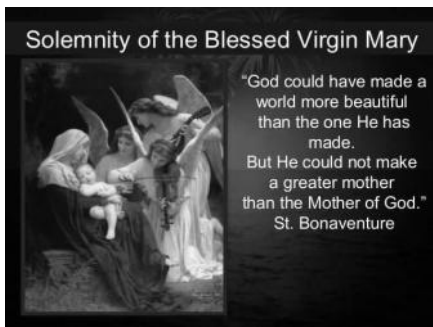

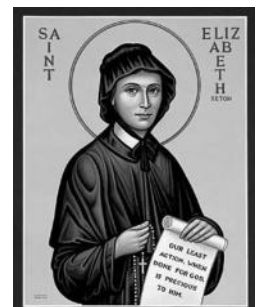

HIGHLIGHTS for 2017...Please contact the parish office if you wish to join us for the **FORTY-SECOND ANNUAL MARCH FOR LIFE** in Washington, DC on **Friday, January 27th** (transportation is provided). *All Saints* opens *Catholic Schools Week* with an extended **OPEN HOUSE** (10:15 am - 1:00 pm) on **Sunday, January 29th**. On **Tuesday, January 31st**, the **Mass of Installation of Bishop John Barres** takes place at St Agnes Cathedral. *Ash Wednesday, March 1st*, starts our Lenten observances with bilingual Stations of the Cross *every Friday* evening. The **Mass of Confirmation** will be on the *Solemnity of Saint Joseph, March 20th* at **4 pm**. We celebrate *Palm Sunday, April 9th*. The **SACRED TRIDUUM** (April 13th-15th) follows with the *Mass of the Lord's Supper* on **HOLY THURSDAY, April 13th at 7:30 pm** (Altar of Repose in the Madonna Room), the *Solemn Celebration of the Passion of the Lord* at **3 pm** and *Stations of the Cross* (at **12:00 pm** through the neighborhood and at **7:30 pm** in the church) on **GOOD FRIDAY, April 14th**, the **EASTER VIGIL** at **8 pm** on **April 15th** and **EASTER** on **Sunday, April 16th**. **Thursday, May 25th** is the *Ascension of the Lord* (Holy Day of Obligation). Nine days later, **Sunday, June 4th**, we celebrate **PENTECOST**, the day on which Bishop Murphy gives permission for the pastor to confirm adult Catholics who missed their confirmation when they were adolescents (*please contact the pastor for information*). The **FORTY-SECOND ANNUAL FEAST OF SAINT ROCCO** runs from **Tuesday, July 25th** to **Sunday, July 30st**. The Feast, which depends on hundreds of dedicated volunteers, is always looking for new workers. Please look for announcements about how to participate. We celebrate the *Assumption of Our Lady* on **Tuesday, August 15th** (a Holy Day of Obligation in 2017), *All Saints* on **Wednesday, November 1st** (Holy Day of Obligation) & the *Commemoration of All Souls* on **Thursday, November 2nd**. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King on **November 26th** and **ADVENT** starts the new liturgical year (Year B) on **Saturday, December 2nd at 4 pm**.

The Lord Jesus knew how easy it is to forget God. Hence, he commanded us to celebrate every Sabbath (Sunday) His Holy Eucharist (Mass), "Do this in memory of me" (Lk. 22:19). "This" refers to the Paschal Mystery, from the Last Supper to His dying on the Cross, for you and for me, His death and His Resurrection. We easily lose in the distractions of daily life and in occasional extraordinary trials our focus on this Divine Mystery. We celebrate Mass, therefore, every Sunday to thank God for creating us, for giving us this beautiful Creation, which makes our existence possible, for our salvation in Jesus and our hope of total transformation in the resurrection of the body and the New Creation. We also celebrate Mass every weekend as a community of believers because we are, by our very nature, social beings. If I don't feel like I'm getting something out of Mass, remember this: we don't go for ourselves alone (or even principally); we go for everyone else! The reverse is also true: everyone else is there for me! If I don't enjoy the music, if I don't get something out of homily, if I am not moved by the ceremonies and even if I don't always experience God's presence and love, remember Christ on the Cross. He was there for you and for me. He commands us to be here for each other – to be like Him, for one another.

Fifth Grade Students Celebrate Santa Lucia Day

Around Christmas time, one of the biggest celebrations in Sweden is Santa Lucia Day on December 13th. The celebration comes from stories that were told by Monks who first brought Christianity to Sweden.

St. Lucia was a young Christian girl who was killed for her faith in 304 A.D. The most common story told about Santa Lucia is that she would secretly bring food to the persecuted Christians in Rome who lived in hiding in the catacombs under the city. She would wear candles on her head so that her hands were free to carry food. Her feast day is December 13th. This was also the Winter Solstice, the shortest day of the year, in the old 'Julian' Calendar, and a pagan festival of lights in Sweden was turned into Santa Lucia Day.

Today, Santa Lucia Day is celebrated by a girl dressed in a white dress with a red sash around her waist, and she wears a crown of candles on her head. She brings light to the dark winters of Scandinavia and welcomes Christmas.

The fifth grade students at All Saints celebrated Santa Lucia Day by processing through the school. They sang a song, told the story of Santa Lucia, and served gingerbread cookies to all.

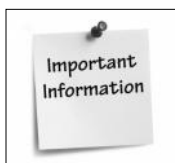
