SUNDAY, MARCH 12, 2017: SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT



Dear Parishioners,

This Saturday marks the Golden Jubilee of my parents' wedding at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church on March 11, 1967 in Jackson Heights, Queens. My Dad, Matt, an Irish immigrant who arrived with my grandparents and aunt in 1948 and grew up in the Bronx, and my Mom, Terry, the daughter of Italian-Americans, Vincent Panettiere and Frances Calabro. The Panettieres (of Lipari) came to America in 1905 and my grandfather was born here, destined to be a doctor (he studied medicine in Rome and Naples in the mid-1930s) because of my great-grandmother, Angelina (small in stature, but powerful in will!); the Calabro family arrived a little later.

My parents met by Divine Providence on an inauspicious day – Friday 13th – in 1962, going to dance at Fordham University, where my Dad was a freshman in the school of business (accounting, though now he wishes it was finance!). My Mom was a senior at girl's high school in Brooklyn (now closed whose name slips my mind). My Dad deeply impressed my Mom because he paid for the subway fare for her and her friend! He has always been a good provider and great with money.

Their wedding was originally planned for the autumn of the preceding year, but my grandmother, Frances, died on October 6, 1966 (32 years later, on the same day, I was ordained a Deacon at St Peter's Basilica). We never met. It's one of life's incalculable sadness to never know your parents' parents. I look forward to meeting her someday, beyond this life, in the Resurrection.

The newly-weds first lived in Eastchester, Westchester. I was born in Jewish Memorial Hospital in Manhattan ten months later; my brother, Father Richard Carr, the following year in February. The young family had outgrown the apartment and it was time to find a new place to live. Ultimately, they found a home in Syosset and we moved to the South Grove area. The good reputation of the schools persuaded my parents to give Syosset a try.

We went to Mass at St Edward's. In those days, the church was bursting with so many new suburbanites. But those days brought much unsettlement and change. My Mom wandered away from the Church for almost two decades, on a spiritual journey that eventually led her back home to the Church in the late 1980s. My Dad faithfully brought my brother and me to Mass. There was never a time we did not go as far as I can remember. It was just what we did, even if we did a lot of roaming around, looking for the most convenient time for Mass.

At the start of the Nineties, we received a tremendous outpouring of grace. My Mom and Dad had found a new happiness in their marriage as they both drew closer to God and their Catholic faith, attending daily Mass. My brother & I received our priestly vocations and they graciously received them.

This was not the life they had planned for themselves or their sons, but they accepted it joyfully. It meant renouncing the hope of grandchildren. Little did they know, however, that it also meant an incredible life that followed. They are now members of numerous families and have more grandchildren than they could have imagined as the parents of priests. I am profoundly proud of my parents, who in the entirely unassuming way have surrendered their own plans for a greater one, God's plan for my brother and me, so that God's grace could be spread more widely through the priesthood. Mom and Dad, I love you. God bless you with many more happy and healthy years!

Questo sabato commemora il Giubileo d'oro del matrimonio dei miei genitori presso la parrocchia del Santissimo Sacramento l'11 marzo 1967 a Jackson Heights, Queens. Mio padre, Matt, un immigrato irlandese, che è arrivato con i miei nonni e la mia zia nel 1948 ed è cresciuto nel Bronx, e mia madre, Terry, la figlia di italo-americani, Vincent Panettiere e Frances Calabro. La famiglia Panettiere (da Lipari) è venuta in America nel 1905 e mio nonno è nato qui, destinato a essere un medico (ha studiato medicina a Roma e Napoli a metà degli anni 1930) a causa della mia bisnonna, Angelina (piccolo di statura, ma potente nella volontà!); la famiglia Calabro è arrivata un po' più tardi.

I miei genitori si sono conosciuti sul dalla Divina Provvidenza in un giorno infausto - venerdì 13 - nel 1962, andando a ballare alla Fordham University, dove mio padre era una matricola nella School of Business (contabilità, anche se ora vuole che fosse la finanza!). Mia madre era un'anziana al liceo della ragazza a Brooklyn (ora chiuso il cui nome si infila la mia mente). Mio padre aveva profondamente colpito la mia mamma, perché ha pagato per la tariffa metropolitana per lei e la sua amica! Lui è sempre stato un buon fornitore e grande con i soldi

Il loro matrimonio è stato originariamente previsto per l'autunno dell'anno precedente, ma mia nonna, Frances, fu morto il 6 ottobre 1966 (32 anni più tardi, lo stesso giorno, io fu ordinato diacono nella Basilica di San Pietro). Non ci siamo mai incontrati. È uno dei tristezza incalcolabile di vita di conoscere mai i genitori dei tuoi genitori. Non vedo l'ora di incontrare il suo giorno, al di là di questa vita, nella risurrezione.

Dapprima, i sposi novelli abitavano in Eastchester, Westchester. Dieci mesi più tardi Sono nato a Jewish Memorial Hospital di Manhattan; mio fratello, Padre Richard Carr, l'anno successivo nel mese di febbraio. La giovane famiglia aveva superato l'appartamento ed è stato il momento di trovare un nuovo posto dove vivere. In ultima analisi, hanno trovato una casa in Syosset e ci siamo trasferiti nella zona di South Grove. La buona reputazione delle scuole aveva convinto i miei genitori a provare Syosset.

Siamo andati alla Messa a St Edward. In quei giorni, la chiesa è stata piena di tanti nuovi suburbani. Ma quei giorni hanno portato molti cambiamenti. Mia madre si allontanò dalla Chiesa per quasi due decenni, in un viaggio spirituale che alla fine lei ha portato alla sua casa nella Chiesa nei tardi 1980s. Mio padre fedelmente portato mio fratello e me alla Messa. Non c'è mai stato un momento in cui non siamo andati, per quanto posso ricordare. Era proprio quello che abbiamo fatto, anche se abbiamo fatto un sacco di girovagare, cercando il momento più conveniente per la Messa.

All'inizio degli anni Novanta, abbiamo ricevuto un enorme effusione di grazia. La mia mamma e papà avevano trovato una nuova felicità nel loro matrimonio in quanto entrambi si avvicinavano a Dio e la fede cattolica, che frequentano la Messa quotidiana. Mio fratello e io abbiamo ricevuto le nostre vocazioni sacerdotali e hanno gentilmente li ha ricevuti.

Questa non era la vita che avevano programmato per sé o per i propri figli, ma la accettò con gioia: significava rinunciare alla speranza di nipoti. Non sapevano, però, che significava anche una vita incredibile che seguì. Ora sono membri delle numerose famiglie e hanno più nipoti di quanto avrebbe potuto immaginare come i genitori di sacerdoti. Sono profondamente orgoglioso dei miei genitori, che in modo del tutto senza pretese si sono arresi i propri piani per uno più grande, il piano di Dio per me e mio fratello, in modo che la grazia di Dio potrebbe essere diffuso più ampiamente attraverso il sacerdozio. Mamma e papà, vi amo. Dio vi benedica con molti anni più felici e sani!

Music Notes



A word from our Music Director

Fasting, one of the three Lenten practices encouraged by the Church, teaches us love of self by showing us what we rely on, what we do not need, and who we are as children of God. During Lent, Many of us will fast from chocolate and junk food, or perhaps television, social media and the like. Did you know that the Church also asks our parish communities for a kind of musical fasting during the holy season? Here at St. Rocco, you will notice that during Lent there is no organ prelude (before Mass), interlude (during Mass), or postlude (after Mass), and that instead, the Introit chant proper to the day is being sung before Mass. This practice is in keeping with the Church's request to refrain from organ or instrumental music during Lent, except to accompany singing. The absence of instrumental music serves to reinforce the solemnity and silence of the season, and to make the joyful noise of Easter all the more glorious. Yet this practice of musical fasting has a deeper meaning. The voice is the primitive and most human instrument. Other instruments are mechanistic extensions of our bodies, but the voice, through the action of the body, most purely expresses the soul. By presenting our voices, vulnerable and free from all external support and all excess, we are reminded of our human condition, standing before God with nothing in between.

Why celebrate St. Joseph's Day?



St. Joseph is regarded by many Italians as their Patron Saint. In many Italian American communities, thanks are given to St. Joseph for his intercession in answering their prayers. The preparation of the Saint Joseph Table is an old Italian tradition which dates back to the Middle Ages. During that time, many parts of Italy were suffering from severe drought. The people prayed

to St. Joseph asking for his intercession in ending the drought. They promised that, if he interceded, they would prepare a large feast to honor him. The rains did come and the people of Italy prepared a large banquet in his honor for all to share.

On **March 19th** the Holy Name Society will offer a banquet, to be shared by all, in honor of St. Joseph the Patron and Protector of the entire Catholic Church. The celebration begins with Holy Mass at 10:15am. The mass will be followed by a procession leading from St. Rocco's Church into the Madonna Room. All are invited to attend this **free** celebration. Food, drink and deserts will be served. Donations, in honor of St. Joseph, will be appreciated.

Make a Meaningful Donation in Honor of St. Joseph

St. Joseph is depicted trapped in a cloak with a blossoming staff of lilies at hand. Each one of these symbols has a special and powerful meaning. On March 19th, all donations and intentions offered to the different symbols of St. Joseph will be presented at the 10:15am Mass. *To make a donation, please contact the parish office before March 19th.*

Cloak of St. Joseph: The Cloak of St. Joseph serves to protect us against all dangers. "With the same solicitude that we help dry the tears of the suffering souls, so too can we hope that St. Joseph will help dry our tears in our necessities. In this way, St. Joseph's Holy Cloak will spread itself over us all and will serve as a shield against all those dangers which beset us so that we may one day, with the grace of God, obtain eternal salvation." (*Donation: \$100*)

Lilies of St. Joseph: As is noted in the teachings of St. Matthew, St. Joseph was a virtuous man who was pure and obedient to God. He had the most difficult task of caring for and protecting the Holy Family. He also remained pure and chaste while loving and caring for his wife, Mary Ever-Virgin. Even though they were married, they remained celibate. The Lilies signify the purity of St. Joseph. (*Donation: \$50*)

Holy Staff of St. Joseph: The Bible tells us that St. Joseph was a "just man". Several legends state that St. Joseph was selected to be Mary's husband after his staff "blossomed" - a sign from God that He had chosen the young man for this responsibility. This is why many statues of St. Joseph depict him carrying a staff topped with lilies in bloom. This act was a true miracle of God. (*Donation: \$25*)

Lenten Season

The season of Lent is a time for Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. Throughout Lent, the students will have opportunities to increase their understanding and participation in these spiritual practices. Some examples include:

Almsgiving. Teachers and students will come together to fundraise for the St. Jude's Children's Hospital by participating in the Marathon. Students will complete a series of grade-appropriate math assignments to help raise money for this foundation.

We are also adopting an elementary school in Paraguay. The students will collect various items needed for an elementary school and have the opportunity to continue to learn about the similarities and differences they share.

Self-Reflection: Every student is going to complete a Lenten Journal. We are a school with a kind H.E.A.R.T. (Help, Encourage, Accept, Respect, Trust others), and by journaling the students have an opportunity for daily self reflection on how they share a kind H.E.A.R.T with everyone.
