SUNDAY, MARCH 19, 2017: THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT



Dear Parishioners,

I want to draw your attention to the upcoming parish calendar meeting, the first of its kind, on Monday, April 3rd at 7:30 pm. At this meeting, we will start to set the parish calendar (July 1, 2017-June 30, 2018) with the intention of not only being more organized, but also to avoid conflicts with other important events and allot parish space fairly. Although this is not a major problem, a calendar -- available online -- will make it much easier for everyone to know about parish events, one of the goals of the plan!

Consequently, I am asking all the parish groups to take some time to set some events for the upcoming year. We will provide event forms on April 3rd. We will collect the forms during the month of April at the end of which time, I will resolve any conflicts, and then we will be ready to publish the calendar in May or June, at the latest. For example, the 100th anniversary of the apparitions at Fatima start on May 13th and run until November 13th. Now is the time to make plans for the parish!

All parish groups should send representatives to the meeting. As it is an open meeting, all are welcome. I have appointed Kelsey the official coordinator of the calendar.

This Monday we welcome Bishop Nelson Perez, for the first time, to St Rocco. He will celebrate the Mass of St Joseph at 4pm at which he will confirm our young people.

A new schedule for our Friday observance of Lent at St Rocco starts this Friday, March 24th. We will hold the Soup Supper at 6:30 pm until about 7:15 pm. At 7 pm, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for Adoration. At the time, a priest will usually be available for confessions. Finally, the evening will conclude with Stations of the Cross in English and Italian at 7:30 pm. Thank you to the Rosarians, Catholic Daughters and Holy Name for helping with the soup suppers this year.

Finally, I am happy to present Father Gabriel's 90% confession flyer, which was received very positively last year. He wrote this article to encourage everyone to get to confession, especially those who have not gone in a long while, principally because they do not know what to confess.

Admittedly, our society is terrible about recognizing sin. We also ignore many sins because if we did recognize them, then we would have to reconsider basic assumptions about our life, our choices, our communities, our nation and our world. Recognizing that our lives are not fully orientated to God, namely, that sin has power over us, is already a sign of God's powerful and efficacious grace opening our hearts and minds.

I can only go to Confession, candidly admit my sins and acknowledge Sin's power over my thoughts, words and deeds if God has already brought me to faith. For this reason, there is a dialectic in the spiritual life, whereby the closer I draw to God, the further away I feel and know I am (because it's true). Nevertheless, God has spanned the unbridgeable gap through the Cross of Christ. He is waiting to embrace us? Why do I make Him wait?

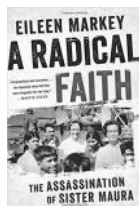

Music Notes

A word from our Music Director



Last week this column addressed the concept of musical fasting during Lent: removing instrumental solos from the celebration of the sacred liturgy. Having touched on the idea that singing is a means of close encounter with God, this week we'll explore this further in relation to the Gospel from this past Sunday: the Transfiguration. As we know, in this Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus takes his disciples up Mount Tabor and is transfigured before them. "Transfiguration" is rooted in the Latin trans (across) and figura (shape or form), and indicates a change of form or appearance. In layman's terms, this means that Christ's human form was transformed to reveal His Divinity. He allowed His disciples, through the revelation of the fullness of His divine and human natures, to glimpse the glories of heaven, so powerfully beautiful that St. Peter, ever impetuous, exclaims that he never wishes to leave!

How does this relate to our understanding of sacred music? Sacred music is a kind of transfiguration. In our voice, which is both a spiritual and physical entity, we can tap into that inseparable union of body and soul which God has created in us. Yet our voices are not produced solely on our own power; we need the breath of life to sustain us. The breath of God, breathed into us, transfigures us and reveals to ourselves and to each other our true nature. In this way, sacred music is sacramental (with a lower-case "s"): that is, it is a visible action pointing to an invisible reality. The other evening, a friend told me of an occasion when she experienced truly sublime sacred music, and thought to herself: "I would be happy to die right here in this moment." Experiences like these, which hopefully many of us have had, allow us a brief foretaste of the perfect happiness and beauty of heaven, and spark in us a longing to remain in that perfection forever. Doesn't that sound like St. Peter?

Just as Christ's Transfiguration did for the disciples, sacred music lifts the veil between heaven and earth, giving us a glimpse of what God has planned for us in His kingdom, where the song of the angels rings without end. Stay tuned next week for a chat about the significance of mountains!

Why celebrate St. Joseph's Day?



St. Joseph is regarded by many Italians as their Patron Saint. In many Italian American communities, thanks are given to St. Joseph for his intercession in answering their prayers. The preparation of the Saint Joseph Table is an old Italian tradition which dates back to the Middle Ages. During that time, many parts of Italy were suffering from severe drought. The people prayed

to St. Joseph asking for his intercession in ending the drought. They promised that, if he interceded, they would prepare a large feast to honor him. The rains did come and the people of Italy prepared a large banquet in his honor for all to share.

This weekend, on **March 19th** the Holy Name Society will offer a banquet, to be shared by all, in honor of St. Joseph the Patron and Protector of the entire Catholic Church. The celebration begins with Holy Mass at 10:15am. The mass will be followed by a procession leading from St. Rocco's Church into the Madonna Room. All are invited to attend this **free** celebration. Food, drink and deserts will be served. Donations, in honor of St. Joseph, will be appreciated.

Make a Meaningful Donation in Honor of St. Joseph

St. Joseph is depicted trapped in a cloak with a blossoming staff of lilies at hand. Each one of these symbols has a special and powerful meaning. On March 19th, all donations and intentions offered to the different symbols of St. Joseph will be presented at the 10:15am Mass. *Donations will still be collected at the banquet.*

Cloak of St. Joseph: The Cloak of St. Joseph serves to protect us against all dangers. "With the same solicitude that we help dry the tears of the suffering souls, so too can we hope that St. Joseph will help dry our tears in our necessities. In this way, St. Joseph's Holy Cloak will spread itself over us all and will serve as a shield against all those dangers which beset us so that we may one day, with the grace of God, obtain eternal salvation." (*Donation: \$100*)

Lilies of St. Joseph: As is noted in the teachings of St. Matthew, St. Joseph was a virtuous man who was pure and obedient to God. He had the most difficult task of caring for and protecting the Holy Family. He also remained pure and chaste while loving and caring for his wife, Mary Ever-Virgin. Even though they were married, they remained celibate. The Lilies signify the purity of St. Joseph. (*Donation: \$50*)

Holy Staff of St. Joseph: The Bible tells us that St. Joseph was a "just man". Several legends state that St. Joseph was selected to be Mary's husband after his staff "blossomed" - a sign from God that He had chosen the young man for this responsibility. This is why many statues of St. Joseph depict him carrying a staff topped with lilies in bloom. This act was a true miracle of God. (*Donation: \$25*)

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work." With your gifts you do the will of the Father and finish the work of Jesus.
